If Ibiza is the extrovert disco queen, Formentera is her naturally beautiful little sister who prefers midnight to stroll barefoot on a moonlit beach. It's 40 years since I last visited and yet remarkably little has changed. Just a half-hour ferry ride from Ibiza, it's in a slow-paced world of its own. April, May, September and October are its best months; avoid August when Italians descend; every one of them hires a moped. Stay at Gecko Beach, eat at Es Calò in Es Calò, Macondo in Sant Ferran or Ca Na Pepa in Sant Francesc, shop at Vintage next to Ca Na Pepa and seek out the beaches at Cala Saona and Playa de Ses Illetes among many gems, unrivalled in the Balearics.
